Augustino LoPrinzi began making ukuleles on a bit of a whim. Long practiced in the design and handcrafting of guitars-both classical and steel string-Augustino was approached by Herb Ohta's manager to create an instrument for the ukulele virtuoso. Ohta-San found the resulting ukulele to

be a delight-and the LoPrinzi name soon became a legend on these small instruments. Cradle a LoPrinzi ukulele in your arms and experience the joy of the simplest instrument-with a sophisticated sound.

Welcome to the 7th annual Tampa Bay Ukulele Getaway!

2016 has been a very busy year for The Tampa Bay Ukulele Society (TBUS).

This year TBUS filed and received 501(c)3 status from the IRS and now operates as a Tax Exempt Charitable Organization. This creates a firm foundation as we continue to deliver programs that support our mission of providing education, entertainment and community service to Tampa Bay.

Our membership is now over 1400 (a 40% increase in 1 year!) and our members have plenty to do. Our monthly event schedule is packed with choices including introduction to ukulele workshops, jams, open mics, movie nights, and traveling artist workshop/performance series at Sam Ash.



Our library program continues to expand as we add more library branches, and it is the most popular adult program in both counties. To date we have had over 1400 attendees at 110 workshops. This year we have expanded our education program providing classes for senior citizen centers, Hospice workers and at the Heritage Village Country Jubilee.

We launched TBUS Cares for expansion of our community services and have provided entertainment and education at assisted living centers, friends of the library functions, churches and community events.

A special thank you to all our volunteers who give so much of their time and energy to make TBUS and all of our programs a success. We also want to thank our corporate sponsors and vendors for their support. And lastly, we thank you for attending TBUG 16. This is our annual fund raiser and it's your attendance and participation that really helps us fund and support our programs.

Daniel Ward teaches ukulele in Los Angeles, California at U-Space and McCabes Guitar Shop as well as at festivals across the country, including the Reno Ukulele Festival, Wine Country Ukulele Festival, Port Townsend WA Ukulele Retreat, Albuquerque Ukekopelli Festival, the Kerville Texas Folk Festival, and the Rocky Mountain Ukulele Festival in Durango just to name a few. Internationally he has taught and played in countries from Mexico to China, and is thrilled to be heading to England this June for the 2016 Ukulele Festival of Great Britian. In 2015 he released his first solo ukulele album, "EL UKULELE', as well as co-authoring "COLOR-ALONG UKULELE", an illustrated method book for all ages.

Manitoba Hal

Manitoba Hal is an accomplished musician and songwriter, but he is best known for his ukulele chops. Hal uses a looping technology to produce a one-man-band experience, adding subtle but important background beats to his extraordinary ukulele strumming and riffing. Many wouldn't associate the ukulele as a blues instrument, but Hal takes out all the hula, leaving only room for deep blues to prevail. After his grandfather gave him a uke in '95, Hal found that it transferred easily from his blues guitar style, complimenting his combination of finger picking and strumming, and gospel vocal style. Hal writes his own blues tunes, and also covers traditional



songs after giving them his own flavor. His songs also breathe with hints of Tin Pan Alley, hit parade, rock, gospel, and folk. Hal is influenced by artists like Robert Johnson and Taj Mahal, Colin Linden, and Big Dave Mclean. As a big blues man with a tiny ukulele, Manitoba Hal makes music with this instrument like no other.

Manitoba Hal has international ukulele endorsements (Ohana Ukuleles and aNueNue) and tours internationally performing and teaching at ukulele festivals worldwide as one of a handful of authentic blues performers performing with the ukulele today.




Heidi Swedberg




Mike Hind







































































































Loop Station - Daniel Ward







PRACTICAL PICKING
